Adventure Begins

To support and celebrate summer reading, the Library held 30 adventure-themed programs attended by 545 children and teens in June and July. Program participants read at least 30 minutes a day, with many reading for longer. Lesa also held weekly storytimes, monthly *Stay and Play* events, and interesting science-based programs throughout the year. In total, the Library held 148 on-site youth programs, including a new *First Friday* story time that started in October.

The Annex at 211 East Street was a busy place in 2024.
